

Rules of the Management of the Student Dormitory Network at I-Shou University

Approved by the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Library and Information Services on November 14, 2012

Promulgated with the consent from the President dated December 21, 2012

Amendments to Provisions I and IV-XIII adopted by the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Library and Information Services on August 31, 2021, and promulgated with the consent from the President dated October 6, 2021

Amendments to Provisions I, III, IV, and X-XII adopted by the Office Affairs Council of the Office of Library and Information Services on December 25, 2024, promulgated with the consent from the President dated January 3, 2025, and come into effect on February 1, 2025

- I. The student dormitory network, as part of the campus network, is established for academic purposes. In order to maximize and manage the student dormitory network, the Rules of the Management of the Student Dormitory Network at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Rules”) are made by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) as per the Ministry of Education Regulations for the Access to the Campus Network and the Regulations for the Use of the Campus Network at I-Shou University.
- II. The users of the student dormitory network are mainly students living in student dormitories of the University (hereinafter referred to as “dormitory residents”).
- III. In order to provide necessary services to dormitory residents, work-study students are specially assigned to conduct network inspections and basic troubleshooting at student dormitories.
- IV. Work-study students responsible for the maintenance of the student dormitory network may provide the following services with authorization from the Office of Library and Information Services (hereinafter referred to as “the Office”):

1. making inspections of physical network ports;
 2. reporting problems arising from the abnormal operation of Internet devices;
 3. providing consulting services regarding network access;
 4. helping dormitory residents set up access to the student dormitory network;
 5. checking users' IP addresses and MAC addresses as well as relevant settings;
 6. disabling the network access of certain users or certain nodes to ensure quality Internet connections at student dormitories, if necessary; and
 7. other services with the permission of the Office.
- V. In order to use the student dormitory network, dormitory residents shall have a personal computer (or laptop), an RJ-45 network interface card, and a UTP Ethernet cable.
- VI. The transmission of any threatening, obscene, unfriendly, or commercial information through the student dormitory network is strictly prohibited.
- VII. Dormitory residents shall use the IP addresses assigned to them based on their dormitory buildings and dormitory rooms. Violators will be denied access to the student dormitory network.
- VIII. If a dormitory resident's computer (or laptop) is found to be infected with a computer virus or to have malicious intrusions into others' computers, and the student dormitory network is therefore affected, they shall be denied access to the student dormitory network.
- IX. The Office takes charge of the management and supervision of the student dormitory network. The Office may ban dormitory residents with major violations from accessing the student dormitory network and report them to the University for further processing.
- X. Dormitory residents are not permitted to transmit mass data irrelevant to teaching, research, or university administration through the student dormitory network. The daily transmission of a single IP address shall not exceed 8GB (including uploading and downloading). The network speed for users who exceed the maximum transmission capacity will be limited to 64Kb/s for twelve hours.
- XI. Any amendments to the aforesaid rules will be announced by the Office. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, shall be subject to the Regulations for the Use of the Campus Network at I-Shou University.
- XII. The Rules become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the Office Affairs Council of the Office and ratified by the President.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstanding regarding the interpretation of the language or

terms of the Rules, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
