

Rules of the Management of Campus Servers at I-Shou University

Approved by the Office Affairs Council on November 14, 2012

Promulgated with the consent from the President dated on December 21, 2012

Amendments to Provisions II-IV, VI, VIII, and IX adopted by the Office Affairs Council on August 31, 2021, and promulgated with the consent from the President dated on October 6, 2021

- I. The Rules of the Management of Campus Servers at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Rules”) are made with the aim of enhancing the information security of campus servers and the quality of network service at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”).
- II. The Rules are applicable to all internet servers that allow external network service used at both administrative and academic units (hereinafter collectively referred to as “the units”) at the University.
- III. The units shall assign personnel to take charge of the management and supervision of the servers set up and managed by them.
- IV. The staff in charge of server management shall oversee the content provided by the service systems. Any unlawful, obscene, or offensive information or inappropriate conduct, and activities that might violate national laws, are absolutely prohibited.
- V. The network service provided by the Taiwan Academic Network shall be used by schools and research institutes for academic purposes only. Any commercial network service is absolutely prohibited.
- VI. The units shall regularly maintain their servers and check for security updates for security reasons.
- VII. If a campus server is reported to have sent spam emails or attacked other internet servers, or it is detected to be breached by hackers, has unusual traffic, or gets involved in an infringement of intellectual property rights or an information security incident, the Office of Library and Information Services may suspend the right of the reported server to access network service.
- VIII. To maximize computer resources at the University, the units shall introduce virtualization to their servers in order to save energy and reduce carbon emission.

IX. The Rules become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the Office Affairs Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of the Rules, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
